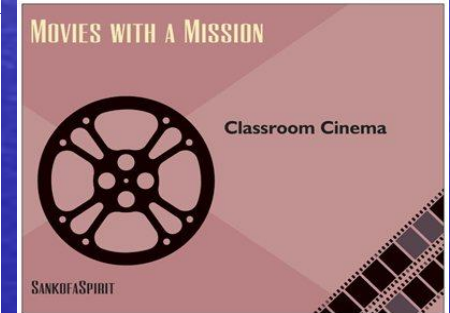
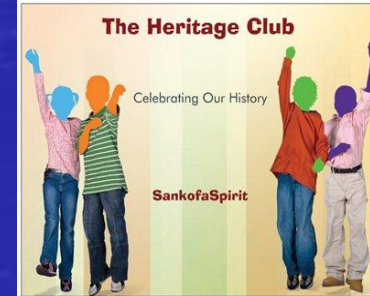

Passport 2 Adventure

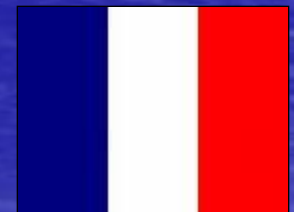
Passport 2 Adventure is an educational travel program designed for 6th-8th grade students to discover the cultural connections between Africa and the African Diaspora.

Our goals for the program are to:

- Create cultural awareness
- Develop a sense of appreciation

The program consist of two (2) components: (1) classroom instruction of the visiting country; and (2) a study tour that will include travel to countries in Africa, the Caribbean, Central and South America, and Europe.

Barbados' success at sugar cultivation made it the blueprint for other islands to follow and during the 18th and 19th centuries the Barbados model became the template on which the Trans – Atlantic World plantation economy was based. This blue print spread as far south as the Guianas and as far north as the Carolinas which were settled by Barbadian planters. It is the first Atlantic economic complex that shapes and influences the development of all other such complexes in the region.

P2A Program

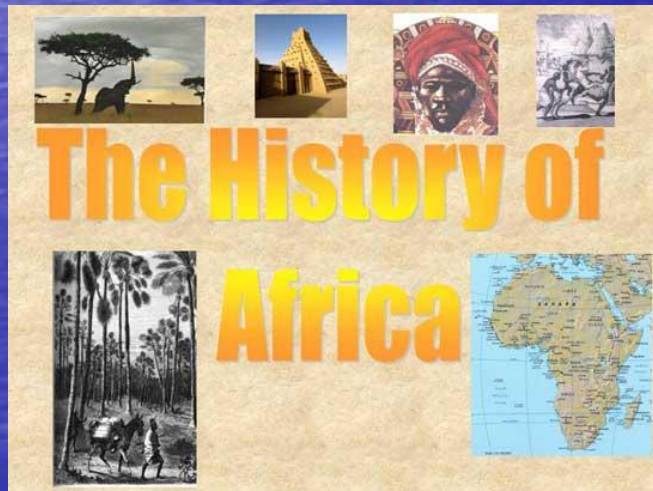

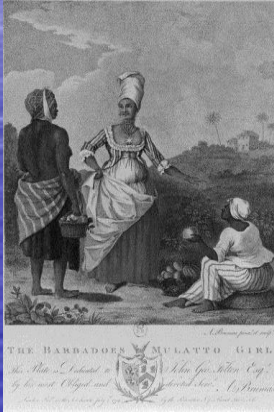
