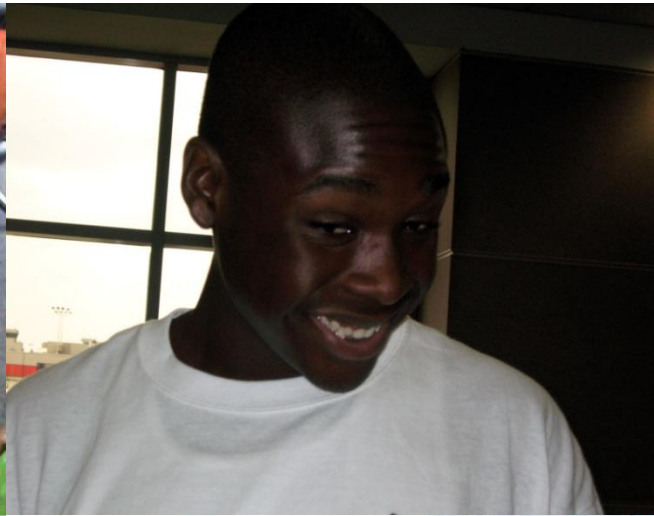

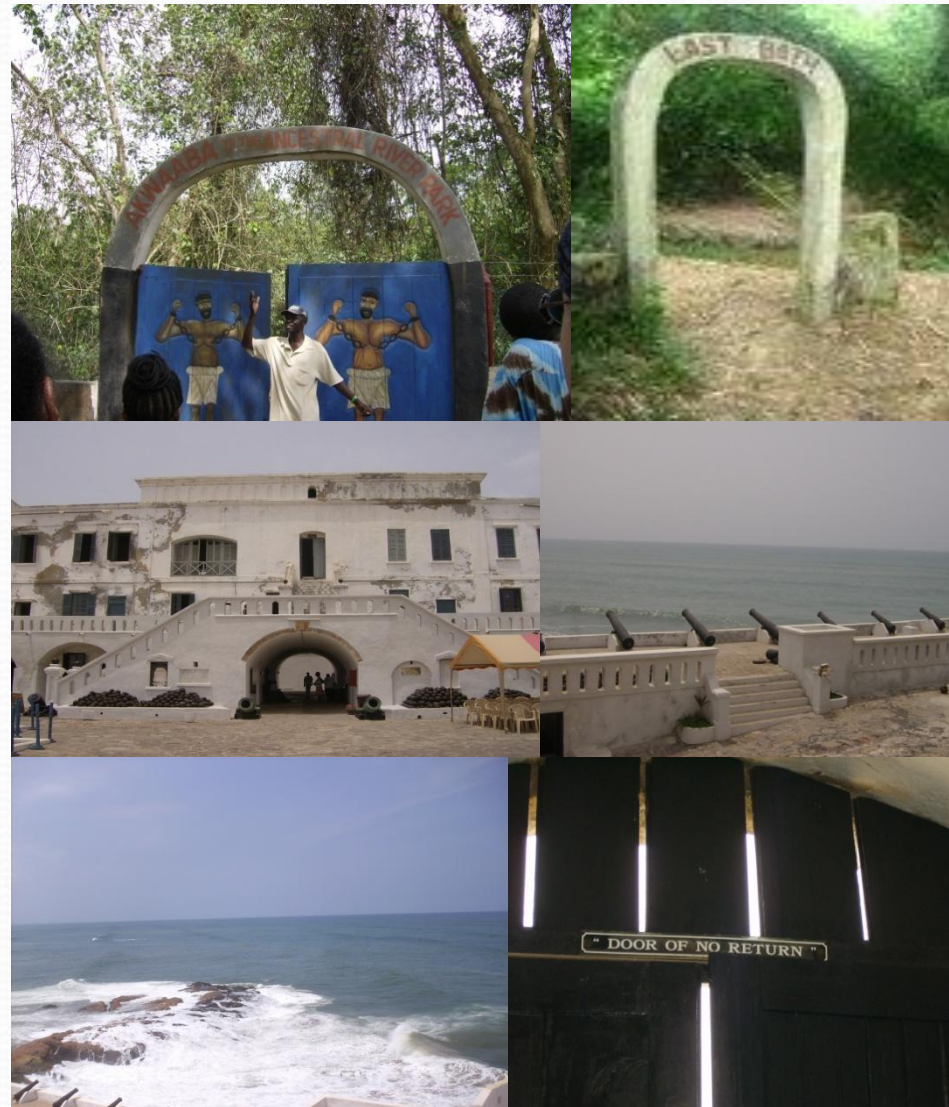
African Naming Ceremony

This is the final resting place for two ancestors whose mortal remains were returned from the USA and Jamaica and re-interred there.

Tour the infamous Forts, Castles and Slave Dungeons of Ghana. History will unfold the story of the slave trade which the impact is still felt beyond the shores of Africa today.



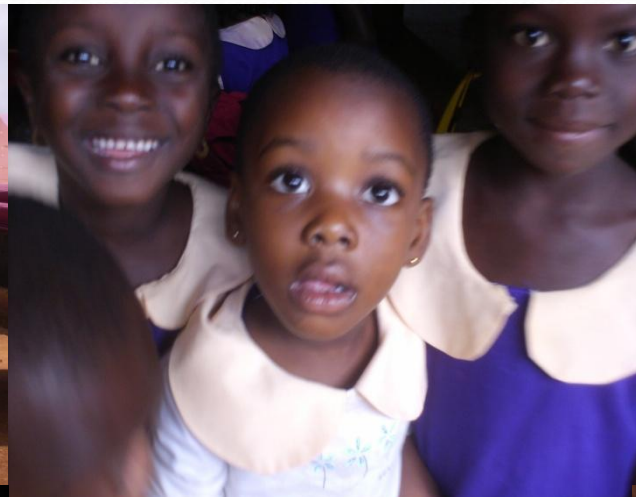
Community Cultural Exchange
